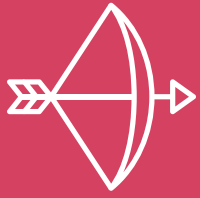

GENERAL MANAGER'S MESSAGE

My adventure with the Foundation started on July 3, 2008—to be more precise, it was at around 8:15 p.m. that my life changed forever.

At the time, I was a lecturer and research associate in the outdoor recreation program at the Université du Québec à Chicoutimi (UQAC). I had just sold my adventure tourism company and was exploring new career possibilities. I spent my time writing and taking photos, some of which were published in outdoors magazines. One of these magazines invited me to take part in an expedition with a group of teenagers with cancer and write an article about the journey. “Why not?” I thought to myself.

Leaned up against a tree, I observed and listened to the teens chat around the fire . . . and that’s when it clicked.

I suddenly understood the power of therapeutic adventures. I could see that the nature and adventure facilitators before me were downright magicians changing lives. I also had a hunch that my path had just taken a turn.

Seventeen years later, I cannot begin to express my profound gratitude to the Board of Directors and the Foundation Team for the trust they put in me. Firstly, by enabling me to go back on about a dozen other expeditions as a volunteer, and then by offering me a seat on the Board as a director in 2011, and then finally by making me general manager in 2015.

The last 10 years have been the most exciting and rewarding years of my career. Working alongside high-calibre professionals brought me to reflect deeply on life. I was able to bring creative solutions to the table. I could go to sleep every night knowing that I brought a bit of comfort to those who needed it.

But above all else, I could see, hear, feel and touch the essence of life: the spirit of giving and the boundless generosity of the On the Tip of the Toes Foundation’s diverse supporters. You’ve inspired me. You’ve reminded me that humans are inherently good.

Now that I’ve crossed over into my fifties, it’s time to take a leap into the unknown. I leave with my head held high, trusting the future, convinced that our world and the Foundation are in good hands.

FRANÇOIS VEILLET



It is with great sadness that we lost one of our directors, François Veillet, from aggressive brain cancer in August.

François Veillet was Senior Vice President and Senior Investment Counsellor, Private Wealth at Fiera Capital and co-founder of the On the Tip of the Toes Foundation. His involvement goes right back to the beginnings of the Foundation in the mid-90s. His sister-in-law at the time was working with therapeutic adventure pioneers in Canada to find financial partners that would allow young people with cancer to experience once-in-a-lifetime expeditions. It wasn't until the preparatory stage of an expedition to Ellesmere Island that François officially met these groundbreakers. Charmed by the mission spearheaded by Mario Bilodeau, François Guillot, Annick Dufresne, Linda Hershon, and Dr. Sylvain Baruchel, without batting an eye, François agreed to join the Board of Directors of the budding Foundation and put his expertise to use.

A lifelong go-getter, François felt privileged to give back, considering himself lucky to have a healthy family. He took his involvement seriously, recruiting board members that have made the organization as strong as it is today. Always aware of what was going on around him, François remained focused on the reason that brought him to the Foundation: young people.

"By getting involved, I wanted to leave my mark on society, do something tangible for young people with cancer. On numerous occasions, I met with them at the departure and arrival of the expeditions. Seeing them transformed is the greatest reward we can hope for!" – François Veillet, excerpt from an On the Tip of the Toes Foundation blog, November 2018

For this martial arts enthusiast, such a dedicated involvement would not have been possible with the unconditional support of his spouse, Francine. "A perfect woman!" in his words. For François, teamwork and the support of his network were primordial. It's actually one of the reasons why he was able to help raise millions of dollars in donations for the On the Tip of the Toes Foundation. The kayak expedition in Greenland is an excellent example of one of his fundraising efforts.

Every year, at the Celebrate Life event, François showed us just how much he cared about the Foundation's mission, and we'll be eternally grateful for that.

Thank you for being here from the start, François, and for having helped make therapeutic adventure expeditions possible for hundreds of young Canadians.

CRAIG MILLER



It is with deep sadness that we learned of the passing of Craig Miller in 2024. His departure leaves a tremendous void not only within the On the Tip of the Toes Foundation, but also in the hearts of all those who had the privilege of crossing his path.

Before joining the Foundation, Craig held a clear vision: to create a foundation that would offer transformative experiences to young people living with cancer through a permanent camp. He was the one who personally approached me to help bring this dream to life. His passion, energy, and conviction immediately convinced me to join him in this endeavor.

For four years, we built this project together with heart and perseverance. And when the time came to grow this vision further, Craig made the courageous and generous decision to merge our efforts with those

Today, we mourn the loss of a friend, a builder, and a deeply compassionate man. Craig is already missed, but his legacy lives on in every one of our expeditions, in every rediscovered smile, in every young adult who regains their confidence.

SYLVIE-MAROIS HONORARY AWARD FOR MARIO BILODEAU



Mario Bilodeau, co-founder of the On the Tip of the Toes Foundation and the outdoor intervention program at the Université du Québec à Chicoutimi and pioneer of nature and adventure therapy in Canada received the Prix Excellence Plein Air 2024 from Aventure Écotourisme Québec at the Congrès Aventure Écotourisme Québec hosted by the Association des parcs régionaux du Québec.

Mario Bilodeau is a pioneer of nature and adventure therapy in Québec. After obtaining a Master's degree in Outdoor Teacher Education from the Northern Illinois University and a Doctorate in Adventure Education Leadership from the University of Northern Colorado, Mario was hired as a

professor of outdoor education at the Université du Québec à Chicoutimi. In collaboration with his colleague André-François Bourbeau, he started the Bachelor of Outdoors and Adventure Tourism, known today as the Bachelor of Nature-Based Therapeutic Recreation.

In 1996, he co-founded the On the Tip of the Toes Foundation with Dr. Sylvain Baruchel and François Guillot to provide therapeutic adventure expeditions to young people with cancer. He also co-founded the Intervention Nature Aventure Québec solidarity cooperative in 2005 to offer nature-based educational or therapeutic experiences.

Today, Mario Bilodeau continues to promote the benefits of nature and adventure. His commitment and devotion profoundly inspire the professionals in our field along with the young people who benefit from his expertise.

INCLUSIVE EXPEDITIONS

In 2024, we endeavoured to adopt an inclusive approach to promote the well-being of all our participants who are sexually or gender diverse.

Our inclusive approach began with two trainings offered by a local organization in Chicoutimi, Diversité 02. These trainings helped to increase the team's understanding of the realities sexually or gender diverse people live with and to undo certain unconscious biases. A trainer from Diversité 02 then provided the team with personalized coaching to address specific issues experienced within the scope of Foundation expeditions, namely involving registration forms, shared sleeping accommodations and icebreaker activities.

We also drafted a non-violence policy with a view to prevent and prohibit any form of discrimination, and this, regardless of grounds (sexual orientation, gender identity, ethnic origin, age, etc.). Our approach will continue to evolve in order to extend our inclusive approach to all minority populations.

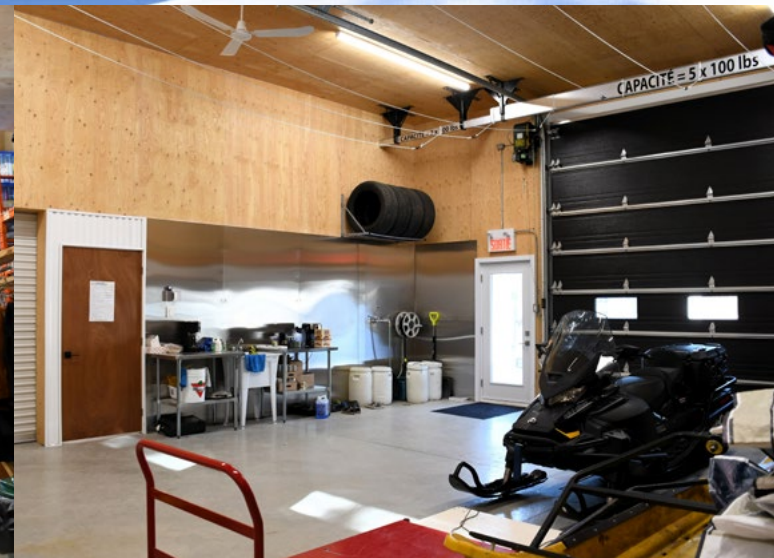
NEW LOGISTICS BASE CAMP

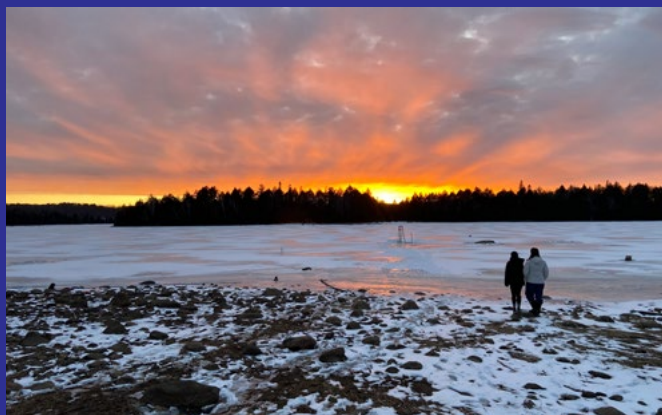

"Two-thirds of the way, we stop for a unique discussion circle. Marie-Michelle opens the door to a discussion about cancer. It's an opportunity for the participants to share a significant moment in their cancer experience with other young people who really understand them. Being a teenager with cancer means being different, sometimes feeling left out and, often, misunderstood. The discussion circle is a safe space of trust, respect and empathy for one another. It's an opportunity to express yourself without being afraid of offending

anyone. Respect is very present in the discussion. The participants listen to each other without judging. It's touching."



This expedition overall brought a sense of belonging, as well as an invoked passion for the wilderness. I find creating these memories with other cancer survivors to be so special. I have always looked back on previous trips with such fondness—they hold a special place in my heart. As well, this trip has accelerated my love for the outdoors, and I hope to use the knowledge I gained on this trip in future personal wilderness expeditions.

"As the days went by, we listened to their stories and their journeys. They touched our hearts, moved us, and made us laugh with their sense of humour about themselves. We were impressed by their ability to step out of their comfort zones, coming from all over the country to greet the unknown, firmly believing that this trip would be good for them. We witnessed their journeys inward over these past few days and were impressed by how their posture changed, how they

stood tall and proud when they left. In such a short time, this expedition enabled them to share their experiences and build solid relationships, discovering their strengths and limits. It's magical what nature can do, but also inspiring to see where the Foundation's adventure therapy facilitators can take them."

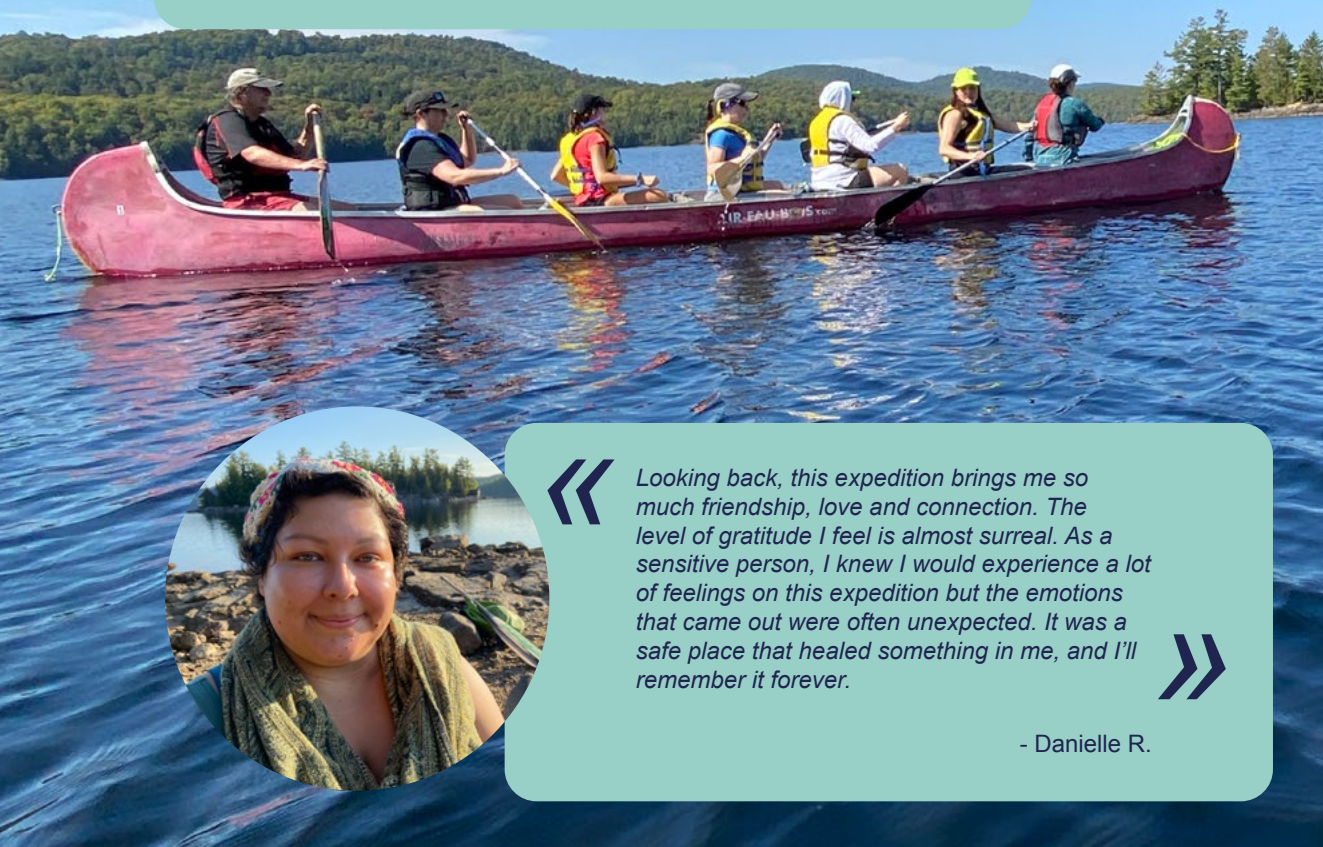
September 19, 2024

"With Maranatha introducing the group and its members, we slowly get to know each other. Despite the fact that we meet for the first time, tongues are soon wagging. The shared experience of illness helps us feel confident and understood . . . but the chats don't stop there. We soon learn that Danielle is planning to write a book about her experience; she feels the need to share a story adapted to people of her age, and to deliver an optimistic message. Michelle shares the difficulties of receiving treatment

far from home and also mentions how much she loves her two-year-old Golden Retriever. In other words, the discussions are lively, alternating between the challenges of the disease and the little everyday things that make life worth living. Even though we hardly know each other, the connection is quickly established."

« After a tough year full of setbacks, the expedition with the Foundation was a breath of fresh air for me. Because everything was so amazingly organized, prepared and thought out for us, I was able to disconnect and focus just on myself. I felt privileged to be able to go on the expedition despite my limitations. After spending wonderful moments in nature, when you get back to the campfire, it's so much easier to express yourself and share your story, your hardships, your fears. The expedition made me realize that it's important to stop and take the time to live in the present moment.

"Sunday's theme: mutual aid. There was a great deal of cooperation between all the participants. Participants who are less mobile are naturally accompanied by others, whether to carry their barrels, fetch their meals or walk to the toilet. All this is done voluntarily and spontaneously, without even being asked. This is what we call "vivre-ensemble" (living together): a

form of cohesion and social solidarity based on their experience. It's both beautiful and touching."

« The expedition enabled me to get out of the house and break my hospital routine, which had become the only routine in my life at that time. I also met other patients in remission who were full of positivity. To see that they had all survived the disease calmed my concerns, because if they could do it, I can do it too. I'm very happy to have made connections with people who've experienced cancer like me. I haven't many new people lately as I haven't been going to school, so I was very happy to socialize with them. I really enjoyed when we all laid down on the beach together to chat and watch the shooting stars and northern lights. »

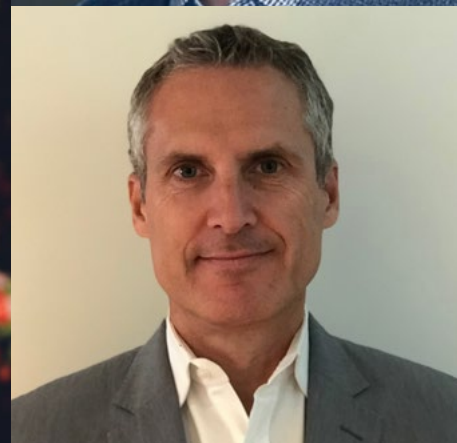

to bestow their generosity on young people with cancer. Their support is critical to the continuation of the On the Tip of the Toes Foundation's mission.

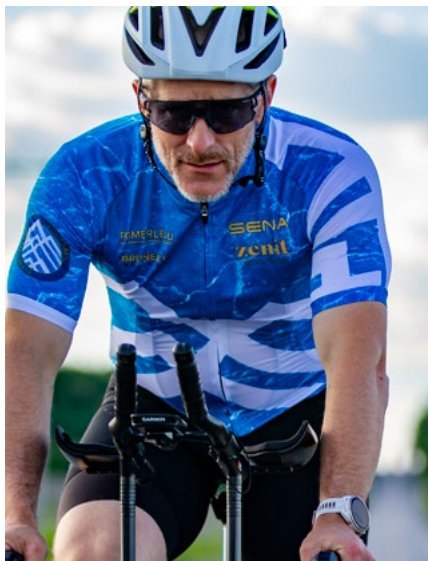

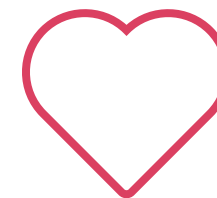

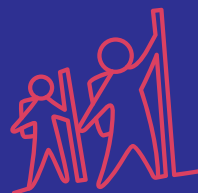




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
