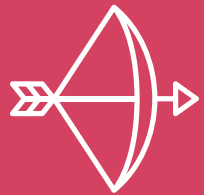

SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT



Committed to reducing our environmental footprint, we integrate eco-responsible practices into the heart of our major events, including the Double Défi des deux Mario and the CRYO Races.

- Mainly digital promotion and communications to limit paper use.
- Maximum waste reduction on sites and courses (no disposable water bottles, participant self-sufficiency).
- Water refill stations available at all times.
- Limited use of single-use materials and prioritization of reusable dishware.
- Rigorous logistical planning to reduce material waste.
- Three-stream sorting stations (waste, recycling, compost) on sites and at aid stations.
- Careful sorting of residual materials during meal services.
- Redistribution of surplus food whenever possible.
- Implementation of eco-responsible toilet management methods on sites and on the lake.
- Active encouragement of carpooling and public transportation for participants, volunteers and teams.
- Use of bus transportation whenever possible.
- Distribution of durable, useful and high-quality promotional items and participation prizes.
- Support for local suppliers, particularly for volunteer meals during the CRYO Races.
- Reduction in the use of single-use plastic bags through reusable alternatives.
- Strict respect for authorized fire locations and no fireworks.

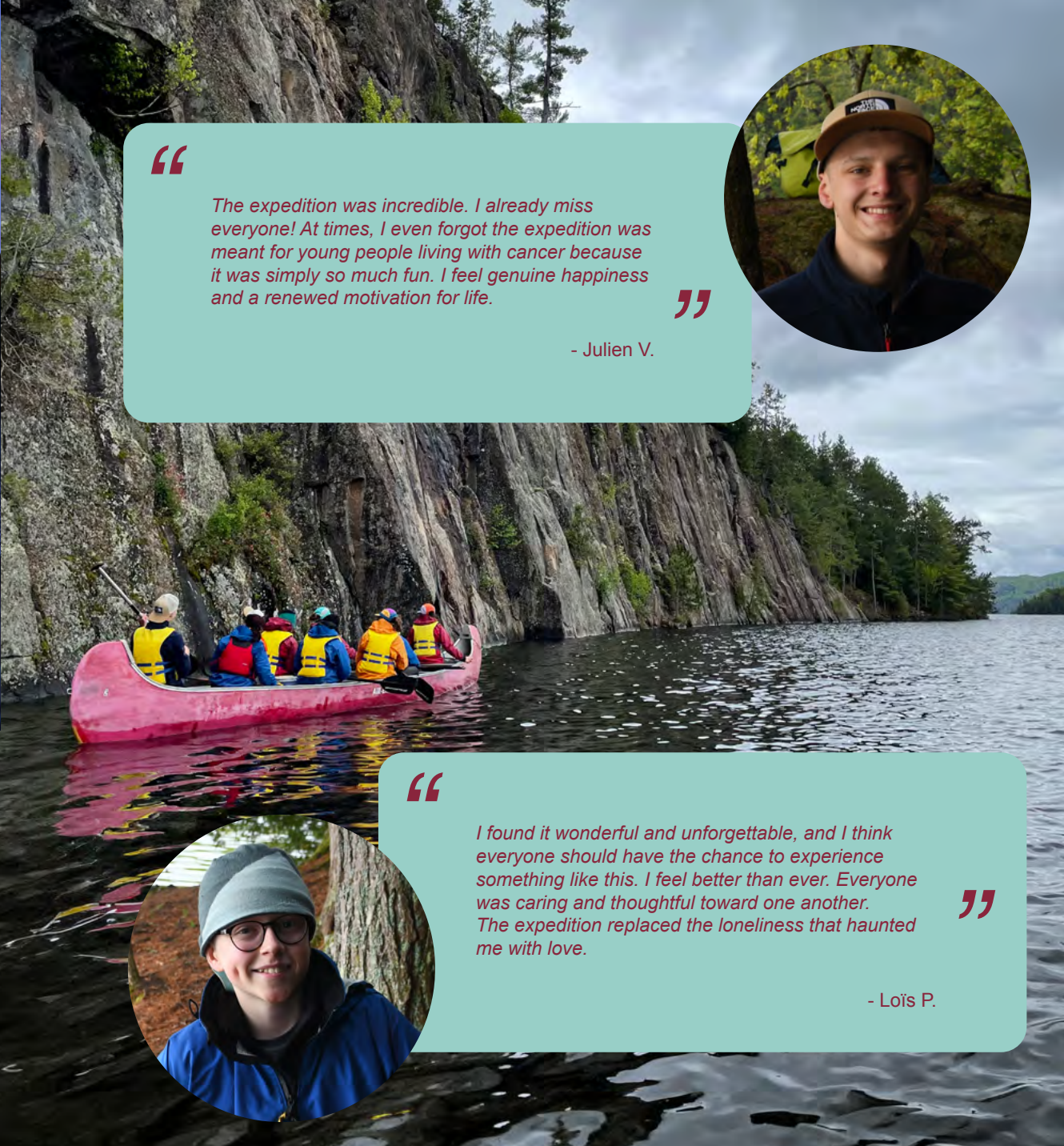

This 17th edition brought together 84 participants engaged in a meaningful winter adventure from January 30 to February 9, despite intense cold and strong winds. The event would not have been possible without the exceptional mobilization of 60 dedicated volunteers. The 2025 CRYO Races took place under exceptionally mild temperatures, creating ideal conditions for the 170 participants registered in the 32 km, 20 km and 12 km races. The event benefited from the support of 125 volunteers, whose dedication ensured smooth and safe logistics.

Several municipalities from the Domaine-du-Roy MRC — including Chambord, Roberval, Saint-Prime and Mashteuiatsh — demonstrated their support for the CRYO Races. An inspiring collaboration also took place with the Bivouaq team, including Alyjah, a former participant in a therapeutic adventure expedition with the Fondation Sur la pointe des pieds.

Chlorophylle also joined the event as a sponsor by providing jackets to race winners and generously offering items to thank our volunteers for their involvement. Television host and producer Dominique Arpin was present on the frozen lake with his signature charisma, and we are grateful for the provincial visibility he brought to the Foundation.

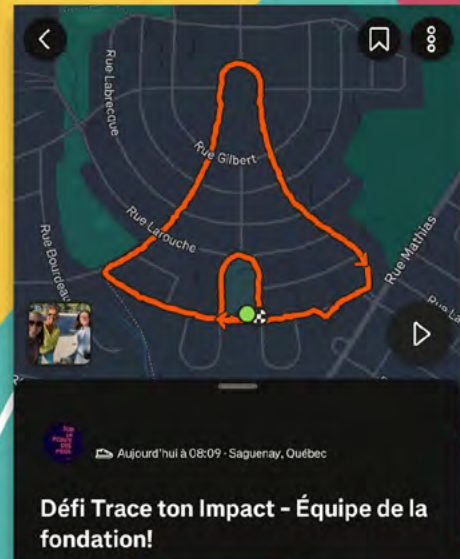
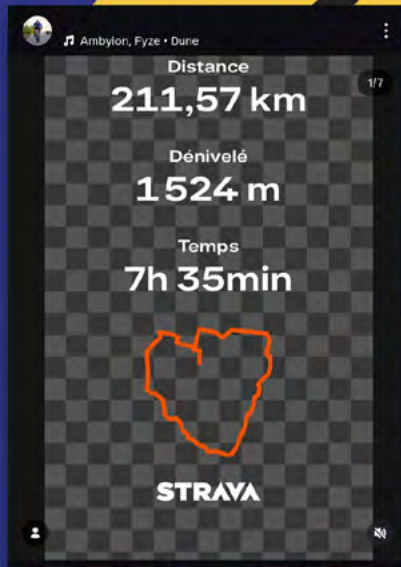

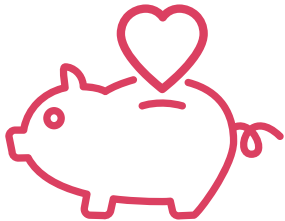
